The Jury of the 1st *Lilly Reich Grant for Equality in Architecture* awards the Grant to the proposal **'Re-enactment: Lilly Reich's work occupies the Barcelona Pavilion'** submitted by **Laura Martínez de Guereñu**.

The jury members have reviewed all the seven (7) proposals submitted to the *1st Lilly Reich Grant for Equality in Architecture* and have submitted their individual votes. The winning proposal has been **'Re-enactment: Lilly Reich's work occupies the Barcelona Pavilion'** submitted by **Laura Martínez de Guereñu**.

The stated reasons for the jury members to recognize this proposal are:

'It fulfills the aims of the Grant - research, dissemination and visibility - also taking into consideration previous knowledge, the relation of project and available time (6 months), and unveiling unchartered material' (Christiane Lange)

'The proposal is solidly founded and based on a thorough knowledge of the existing sources and archival material. Focus on the 1929 Barcelona exhibition design is well chosen, since this is one of the rare cases where we have clear and ample evidence of Lilly Reich's contribution as well as a comparatively good photographic documentation of the work achieved.' 'It proposes a very definite, framed and specific research, with a materialized result that, if institutional support is achieved, would result in a physical installation in a public building that would allow a missing work to be visualized in situ' (Inés Sánchez de Madariaga)
